ROAD AND LAND DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

Travis County Precinct 3 Traffic Projects Surrounding Onion Creek Meadows,

The project to widen Old San Antonio Road is now designed to county standards, but the county is awaiting City of Austin approval for variances. The county submitted the plans to City of Austin Permitting on Dec. 20, 2023, and the City of Austin has not granted the variances yet.

Bike Lanes: The main bike lane project will be with Old San Antonio Road. The County is planning on adding pavement on both sides of Old San Antonio Road from FM1626 to Puryear Road to facilitate bike traffic.

On Twin Creeks Road, the County has proposed a bond project to widen Twin Creeks Road from two lanes to three lanes with 4-foot shoulders and 10-foot SUP. This project did not make the County's 2017 Bond list, but when the County proposed it for the 2023 Bond list, it was not chosen by the 2023 Citizens Advisory Bond Committee. The County wants to keep it on the list for the next Bond.

For Twin Creeks Road, especially in the area near the entrance of the Bear Creek Crossing neighborhood, crash data is being studied by the County, and a field visit occurred. Recommendations are being made for appropriate warning signs.

Also, the County's 2023 Bond Project Election (which passed on Election Day 2023) approved greenway trails in our general area, including, on the Onion Creek Greenway, construction of greenway trails and amenities from the US 183 and Onion Creek trailhead east to Moya Park and west to McKinney Falls State Park. It includes allowing for strategic parkland acquisition and conservation alongside Onion Creek.

History of Manchaca

Archaeologists have found evidence that indicate man had settled in the Manchaca area long before settlers arrived. The creeks and lush forests provided a good environment for the early Indians of Central Texas. The Tonkawa and their predecessors inhabited this area.

El Camino Real de los Tejas, represented in sections of the "Old San Antonio Road" helped to develop Manchaca by pointing the way through the Texas wilderness. At the Onion Creek Bridge along the old road, wagon wheels have worn ruts in the limestone creek bottom put there long before a bridge was constructed.



Manchaca takes its name from the Springs that lie South of present day Manchaca along the "Old San Antonio Road'.

Manchaca takes its name from the Springs that lie South of present day Manchaca along the "Old San Antonio Road'. When New York's Central Park landscape designer, Fredrick Olmsted traveled to Texas in 1854, he stayed at what some believe was a type of hotel at the Springs owned by Adolphus Weir. He recorded his experiences in his famous book, A Journey, Through Texas, published in 1857, the following description:

"We found a plantation that would have done no discredit to Virginia. The house was large and well constructed, standing in a thick grove, separated from the prairie by a worm wood fence. Adjacent, within, was the spring which deserved its prominence of mention upon the maps. Is had been tastefully grottoed with heavy limestone rocks, now water-stained and mossy...Everything about the house was orderly and neat. We were ushered into a snug supper-room and found a table set with wheat-bread, ham, tea and preserved fruits waited on by tidy and ready girls."

Several stagecoach lines ran along Old San Antonio Road, stopping at the Springs to rest and refresh both the passengers as well as the horses. "Scott Stage Line" ran an ad in the Austin City Directory in 1877, claiming just 14 hours travel time for their coaches from Austin via Manchaca Springs to San Antonio.

The population really begin to grow when the International & Great Northern Railroad laid track through Manchaca in 1881. This led to the building of a new school and several mercantile stores and churches. By the turn of the century Manchaca had grown into a thriving community.
